+ **health problems related to kidney, cardiovascular or liver diseases**



### Vitality Support

In accordance with the veterinary diets **Renal & Cardiac** and **Hepatic**

+ **musculoskeletal problems** (e.g. difficulty getting up, stiffness)



### Mobility Support

In accordance with the veterinary diets **Joint & Mobility** and **Joint & Mobility Low Calorie**

+ **allergies, coat and skin sensitivity problems** (e.g. red or dry, scaly skin, excessive hair loss)



### Hypoallergenic

In accordance with the veterinary diet **Hypoallergenic Skin & Coat Support**

+ **urinary tract problems**



### Urinary Care

In accordance with the veterinary diet **Struvite**



## Dealing with your dog's overweight or diabetes?

Do you feed the dog the Diabetes & Obesity veterinary-approved diet? Reward the dog with a crunchy veterinary treat containing fresh meat.

### WEIGHT MANAGEMENT

In accordance with the veterinary diet Diabetes & Obesity:

- + Low level of calories
- + Higher level of fibre (lignocellulose and psyllium)
- + Support of weight management



## Does your dog suffer kidney-related health problems or problems related to cardiovascular or liver disease?

Do you feed the dog the Renal, Cardiac or Hepatic veterinary diets? Your dog deserves a deliciously crunchy veterinary treat with fresh meat.

### VITALITY SUPPORT

In accordance with the veterinary diets Renal & Cardiac and Hepatic:

- + Special protein sources
- + Balanced minerals & protein
- + Support of liver & detoxification (milk thistle seed, fulvic acid)



## Does your dog suffer from indigestion (e.g. bloating, digestive problems)?

Do you feed the dog the Gastrointestinal & Pancreas veterinary diet? Choose a crunchy veterinary treat with fresh meat.

### GASTROINTESTINAL SUPPORT

In accordance with the veterinary diet Gastrointestinal & Pancreas:

- + Highly digestible ingredients
- + Support of intestinal function (MOS, FOS,  $\beta$ -glucans & *Lactobacillus helveticus*)
- + Support of detoxification (fulvic acid)



## + Good to know...

- ... the daily dose of treats should not exceed 10% of the total recommended daily intake of calories
- ... veterinary treats are not a substitute for a veterinary-approved diet
- ... always follow your vet's instructions





What if the dog develops problems with the musculoskeletal system, where you can see it has difficulty getting up or limping?

Do you feed the dog the Joint & Mobility or even Joint & Mobility Low Calorie diet? Introduce your dog to a semi-moist veterinary treat with fresh meat.

### MOBILITY SUPPORT

In accordance with the veterinary diets Joint & Mobility and Joint & Mobility Low Calorie:

- + Added MSM and *Boswellia serrata*
- + Source of Omega 3 (herring, krill protein and *Schizochytrium limacinum*)
- + Joint protection (glucosamine, chondroitin sulphate)



Is your dog sensitive? Has it been diagnosed with allergies? Does it have a coat problem or a skin sensitivity problem, such as red or dry, scaly skin? Does it suffer from excessive hair loss?

Do you feed the dog the Hypoallergenic veterinary diet? Treat your dog with confidence to a semi-moist veterinary treat containing fresh meat.

### HYPOALLERGENIC

In accordance with the veterinary diet Hypoallergenic Skin & Coat Support:

- + Selected protein and carbohydrate sources
- + Support of skin function (omega 3, linseed oil)
- + Grain free & NO chicken



Is your dog having problems with its urinary tract?

Already feeding your dog the Struvite veterinary-approved diet? A semi-moist veterinary treat containing fresh meat is full of beneficial ingredients that is just right for it.

### URINARY CARE

In accordance with the veterinary diet Struvite:

- + Balanced levels of minerals
- + Urinary tract support (dried *Vaccinium vitis-idaea*, *Urtica dioica* a *Carlina acaulis*)
- + L-methionine
